EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

1. CONTEXT OF THE PROPOSAL

On the basis of the relevant negotiation directives¹, the Commission on behalf of the Union negotiated with the Government of Denmark and Government of Greenland in view of renewing the Protocol to the Fisheries Partnership Agreement between the European Union on the one hand and the Government of Denmark and the Home Rule Government of Greenland, on the other hand. Following these negotiations, a new Protocol was initialled on 20 March 2015. It covers a period of five years from the date of provisional application laid down in its Article 14 – i.e. from the date of its signature and from 1 January 2016 at the earliest.

The new Protocol is in line with the objectives of the Fisheries Partnership Agreement, strengthens the cooperation between the Union and Greenland and promotes a partnership framework in which to develop a sustainable fisheries policy and responsible exploitation of fishery resources in the Greenlandic fishing zone in the interest of both Parties. It grants fishing opportunities to Union vessels in the fishing zone of Greenland, in line with relevant conservation and management measures and within the limits of the available surplus.

The two Parties have agreed to cooperate to implement Greenlandic sectoral fisheries policy and to that end shall continue the policy dialogue on the relevant programming.

The Commission proposes, on this basis, that the Council adopts this Decision.

2. RESULTS OF CONSULTATIONS WITH THE INTERESTED PARTIES AND IMPACT ASSESSMENTS

The interested parties were consulted during the ex-post evaluation of the Protocol for the period 2013-15. Experts from the Member States and industry were also consulted in technical meetings. Furthermore, the evaluation reflects the views of the Greenlandic fisheries authorities and stakeholders. These consultations led to the conclusion that it would be beneficial for both Greenland and the Union to renew the Protocol to the Fisheries Partnership Agreement.

3. LEGAL ELEMENTS OF THE PROPOSAL

This procedure on the Council Decision, with the consent of the European Parliament, of the conclusion of the new Protocol is launched in parallel with the procedure regarding the signing on behalf of the EU and provisional application of the new Protocol.

4. BUDGETARY IMPLICATION

The new Protocol provides for a total annual financial contribution of EUR 17.799.978 per year for its duration. This amount corresponds to: a) EUR 13.168.978 per year for the access to the Greenlandic fishing zone, b) EUR 2.931.000 per year, corresponding to the additional envelope paid by the EU in support of Greenland's fisheries policy and c) EUR 1.700.000 as an annual reserve for additional and new fishing opportunities that may be accepted by the EU subject to scientific advice and surplus resources.

THE COUNCIL OF THE EUROPEAN UNION,

Having regard to the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union, and in particular Article 43(2) in conjunction with Article 218(6) second subparagraph, point (a)(v) and Article 218(7) thereof,

Having regard to the proposal from the European Commission,

Having regard to the consent of the European Parliament²,

Whereas:

- (1) On 28 June 2007 the Council adopted Regulation (EC) No 753/2007 on the conclusion of the Fisheries Partnership Agreement between the European Community on the one hand, and the Government of Denmark and the Home Rule Government of Greenland, on the other hand³ ('the Partnership Agreement').
- (2) The Council authorised the Commission to negotiate a new protocol to the Partnership Agreement granting Union vessels fishing possibilities in the fishing zone of Greenland. Following completion of those negotiations, a new Protocol was initialled on 20 March 2015.
- (3) By Decision .../2015/EU⁴, the Council authorised the signing and provisional application of that Protocol, subject to its conclusion.
- (4) The Protocol should be approved on behalf of the Union.
- (5) Article 10 of the Partnership Agreement establishes a Joint Committee to monitor the implementation, interpretation and application of the Agreement and to reassess, where necessary, the level of fishing opportunities and, consequently, of the financial contribution. With a view to implementing such changes, it is appropriate to empower the Commission to approve them under a simplified procedure,

HAS ADOPTED THIS DECISION:

Article 1

The Protocol setting out the fishing opportunities and the financial contribution provided for by the Fisheries Partnership Agreement between the European Community, on the one hand,

and the Government of Denmark and the Home Rule Government of Greenland, on the other hand ('the Protocol'), is hereby approved on behalf of the Union.

The text of the Protocol is in Annex I to this Decision.

Article 2

The President of the Council shall designate the person empowered to proceed, on behalf of the Union, to the notification referred to in Article 15 of the Protocol, in order to express the consent of the Union to be bound by the Protocol.

Article 3

Subject to the provisions and conditions set out in Annex II to this Decision, the Commission shall be empowered to approve, on behalf of the Union, modifications to the Protocol adopted in the Joint Committee established by Article 10 of the Fisheries Partnership Agreement referred to in Article 1 of this Decision.

Article 4

This Decision shall enter into force on the third day following that of its publication in the *Official Journal of the European Union*.

LEGISLATIVE FINANCIAL STATEMENT

1. FRAMEWORK OF THE PROPOSAL/INITIATIVE

1.1. Title of the proposal/initiative

Proposal for a Council Decision on the conclusion of the Protocol setting out the fishing opportunities and financial contribution provided for in the Fisheries Partnership Agreement between the European Community on the one hand, and the Government of Denmark and the Home Rule Government of Greenland, on the other hand.

1.2. Policy area(s) concerned in the ABM/ABB structure

11. – Maritime Affairs and Fisheries

11.03 – Compulsory contributions to regional fisheries management organisations (RFMOs) and other international organisations and sustainable fisheries agreements (SFAs).

1.3. Nature of the proposal/initiative

The proposal/initiative relates to the extension of an existing action.

1.4. Objective(s)

1.4.1 The Commission's multiannual strategic objective(s) targeted by the proposal/initiative

The negotiation and conclusion of fisheries agreements with third countries meets the general objective of giving EU fishing vessels access to fishing zones under the jurisdiction of third countries and developing partnerships with those countries with a view to strengthening the sustainable exploitation of fishery resources outside EU waters.

The Sustainable Fisheries Partnership Agreements (SFPAs) also ensure consistency between the principles governing the Common Fisheries Policy and the commitments made under other European policies (sustainable use of third-country resources, combating illegal, unreported and unregulated (IUU) fishing, integration of partner countries into the global economy and better political and financial governance of fisheries).

1.4.2 Specific objective(s) and ABM/ABB activity(ies) concerned

Specific Objective 1:

To contribute to sustainable fishing in non-EU waters, maintain a European presence in distant-water fisheries and protect the interests of the European fisheries sector and consumers by negotiating and concluding SFPAs with coastal states, consistent with other European policies.

ABM/ABB activity(ies) concerned

To establish a governance framework for fishing activities carried out by Union fishing vessels in third country waters (SFAs) (budget line 11.03.01).

1.4.3 Expected result(s) and impact

The conclusion of the Protocol will help maintain fishing opportunities for EU vessels in the fishing zone of Greenland.

The Protocol will also contribute to better management and conservation of fishery resources, through financial support (sectoral support) for the implementation of programmes adopted at

national level by the partner country, in particular as regards monitoring and combating illegal fishing.

1.4.4 Indicators of results and impact

Rates of utilisation of fishing opportunities (uptake of fishing authorisations as a percentage of availability under the Protocol);

Gathering and analysing data on catches and the commercial value of the Agreement;

Contribution to employment and to added value in the EU and to stabilising the EU market (in aggregate with other SFPAs);

Number of technical meetings and meetings of the Joint Committee.

1.5. Grounds for the proposal/initiative

1.5.1 Requirement(s) to be met in the short or long term

The existing Protocol for the period 2013-15 will expire on 31 December 2015. It is intended that the new Protocol will apply provisionally as of 1 January 2016. To secure continuity of fishing operations, a procedure for adoption by the Council of a decision on the signature and provisional application of the Protocol has been launched in parallel with a procedure for its conclusion.

The new Protocol will provide a framework for the fishing activities of the Union fleet in the fishing zone of Greenland and will allow Union vessel owners to apply for fishing authorisations by Greenland. In addition, the new Protocol enhances cooperation between the EU and Greenland, with a view to promote the development of a sustainable fishing policy. It provides, in particular, for vessels to be monitored via VMS and for the timely transmission of catch data., including by means of relevant IT systems once they become operational. Sectoral support has been strengthened to help Greenland manage and conserve its fisheries resources and monitor the compliance of domestic and foreign fleets.

1.5.2 Added value of EU involvement

As far as this new Protocol is concerned, failure to act by the EU would be to the detriment of Greenland's capacity to ensure good governance of the fisheries sector, and could have a negative impact on the sustainability of fishing activities. This Protocol is also of strategic importance for the activities of Union vessels in the fishing zones of other key bilateral partners in the North-East Atlantic, notably Norway and Faroe Islands .

1.5.3 Lessons learned from similar experiences in the past

The EU fishing opportunities are based on best scientific advice, coastal States management agreements and the surplus resources. The new Protocol ensures improved value for money for the EU by aligning the level of fishing opportunities with the effective level of utilisation. It strengthens the bilateral cooperation for the sustainable management and exploitation of fish stocks and provides for transparency of fishing activities of third countries in Greenland waters. The principle of fair distribution of the costs of access is implemented in line with the reformed Common Fisheries Policy, resulting in an increased contribution by EU economic operators to Greenland. Sectoral support has been strengthened to take into account programmes previously implemented and to reflect the needs of Greenland's fisheries administration.

1.5.4 Compatibility and possible synergy with other appropriate instruments

Funds paid out under SFPAs constitute tangible revenue in the budgets of the third-country partners. However, the conclusion and monitoring of SFPAs is subject to the condition to assign some of these funds to the implementation of measures forming part of the country's sectoral fisheries policy in line with its priorities. These financial resources are compatible with other funding provided by the EU to Greenlands as well as other international donor funding for carrying out projects and/or programmes at national level in the fisheries sector.

1.6. Duration and financial impact

Proposal/initiative of **limited duration**

Proposal/initiative in effect from 1.1.2016 until 31.12.2020.

Financial impact from 2016 to 2020.

1.7. Management method(s) envisaged

Direct management by the Commission

By its departments.

2. MANAGEMENT MEASURES

2.1. Monitoring and reporting rules

The Commission (DG MARE) will ensure regular monitoring of the implementation of this Protocol, particularly as regards operators' use of fishing opportunities and in terms of catch data.

The Sustainable Fisheries Partnership Agreement provides for at least one annual meeting of the Joint Committee, at which the Commission and the third country concerned review the implementation of the Agreement and the Protocol thereto and, if necessary, adjust the programming of sectoral support and, where applicable, the financial contribution.

2.2. Management and control system

2.2.1 Risk(s) identified

There is some risk in setting up a fisheries protocol, particularly with regard to the amounts intended to finance the sectoral fisheries policy (under-programming). These difficulties were not encountered with Greenland during the implementation of the 2013-15 Protocol.

2.2.2 Control method(s) envisaged

To avoid these risks, extensive dialogue is planned on the programming and implementation of the sectoral policy. Joint analysis of results, as referred to in Article 5(4) of the Protocol, also forms part of these control methods.

In addition, the Protocol contains specific clauses for its suspension, on certain conditions and in given circumstances.

2.3. Measures to prevent fraud and irregularities

The Commission undertakes to establish regular consultation and a political dialogue with Greenland with a view to improving the management of the Agreement and strengthening the EU's contribution to the sustainable management of fishery resources. In any case, any payment which the Commission makes under an SFPA is subject to the Commission's standard rules and budgetary and financial procedures. This makes it possible, in particular, to

fully identify the bank accounts of the third countries into which the financial contribution is paid. For this particular Protocol, Article 4(7) stipulates that the financial contribution must be paid into a Public Treasury account.
